2023–24 was a year of bold steps forward. We expanded across 8 states, 20+ schools, and 10+ community centres, reaching thousands of children and youth with opportunities they never imagined possible.

From digital classrooms in Uttarakhand and Maharashtra to spoken English exchanges between India and Dubai, from skill development workshops in rural villages to festivals that brought entire communities together — our work grew deeper, wider, and more impactful.

We also strengthened our internship programs with top business schools, nurturing socially conscious future leaders, while continuing to engage 3000+ volunteers worldwide.

Established 5+ new digital classrooms and toy libraries, bridging rural-urban gaps.

We work to make quality education and skill development accessible to children from underprivileged communities across India through innovative, low-cost, and scalable models. Guided by our vision to spread the light of education among the underprivileged children of our society, we design joyful, inclusive, and future-ready learning environments.

- **Project Kitab Khlona:** Toy & Book Libraries filled with curated educational toys, story cards, flashcards, puzzles, brain gym and finger gym tools, agility kits, art kits, and musical instruments.
- **Project Tech Pathshala:** Fully equipped computer labs that introduce students to digital literacy, online research, and typing/navigation skills.
- **Project E-Shiksha / E-Smart Kit:** Digital classroom kits with offline, board-aligned content, videos, and skill-based modules in multiple languages.

- **SS-Academy:** NEP-aligned teacher training focused on experiential learning, classroom management, and integrating stories, movement, and arts into teaching.

- **English-on-Call:** Spoken English modules delivered in contextual, accessible formats to school and college learners.
- **Model School Program:** Comprehensive partnerships with schools and community centers to build sustainable, replicable education models.

SHIKSHALAYA 2021–22: BUILDING LEARNING ECOSYSTEMS



Project Kitab Khilona – Toy & Book Libraries

Education is not confined to blackboards — it lives in play, stories, and imagination. In 2023–24, Sampoorna Shiksha created vibrant Toy & Book Libraries that became the beating heart of learning in underserved communities.

- At **DNPS, Rishikesh**, over **250 children** stepped into a colourful world of puzzles, flashcards, and story cards, where classrooms transformed into spaces of discovery.
- In the small villages of **Kamad (60 children) and Dalwalla (100 children)**, libraries brought children their first touch of curated toys and art kits, encouraging creative play and collaborative learning.
- In **Nainital (150 children)**, a resource-rich library turned into a hub where children gathered daily to read, play, and learn.
- In **Kerala, through Ovee Trust (200 children)**, play-based learning gave a new rhythm to classrooms, ensuring every child had access to the joy of imagination.

Together, these libraries reached 760+ children, ensuring that even in the remotest corners, children could experience education not as a burden, but as playful exploration.

Project E-Shiksha / E-Smart Kit – Digital Classrooms

Technology became a bridge to equity in 2023–24. Through E-Shiksha Kits and Interactive TVs, we gave thousands of children the chance to learn through audio-visual content, interactive lessons, and offline board-aligned resources.

- **At Shivananda School, Rishikesh (500 children)**, a complete E-Shiksha Kit transformed chalk-and-talk teaching into a multimedia experience, bringing concepts alive in Hindi and English.
- **At ZP School, Beed (650 children)** in Maharashtra, classrooms went digital for the first time. Students explored subjects through videos, practice modules, and offline content libraries, making learning far more engaging.
- **At Pt. Motilal School, Navi Mumbai (500 children)**, the installation of an Interactive TV created a digital-first environment where lessons could be taught with images, animations, and interactive exercises.

With 1,650 students benefiting, these projects proved that when technology reaches rural classrooms, children gain not just knowledge, but also confidence to compete with peers across India.

English on Call

Language opens doors. Through Learn-on-Call, Sampoorna Shiksha created a bridge between rural learners and volunteers from across India and Dubai.

In **Tamil Nadu (30 children), Delhi (30 children), and West Bengal (40 children)**, children dialed in daily or joined online sessions where they practiced conversational English, grammar, and everyday vocabulary. For the first time, many students got to hear and respond in English with mentors beyond their own community. With 100 children directly benefitting, the program became not just about language, but about building confidence, expression, and aspiration.

Skill Development Programs

- **At Anjuman Islam School**, more than 100 students earned their Tally ACE Certification, preparing them for employment in finance and accounting sectors.
- **At Seva Sahyog Trust**, career counselling sessions helped learners understand their strengths, map aspirations, and identify higher education pathways.
- **At Aashray Foundation (Pune)**, more than 20 Pardhi children — from a marginalized, often excluded community — received basic mathematics training, giving them tools of confidence for daily life and future learning.
- **At Pragati Vidyalaya, Delhi**, over 100 students joined life skills and leadership workshops where they practiced decision-making, problem-solving, and teamwork.

Skill Development Programs

- **At ITM Business School**, Navi Mumbai, 15 interns in the first batch and 71 interns in the second batch spent 21 days working intensively on-ground. From classroom facilitation to research and project design, they brought fresh energy while learning about grassroots realities.
- **At SIES Business School**, Navi Mumbai, 5 interns engaged full-time in program delivery and monitoring.
- **At Somaiya College of Education**, 8 B.Ed interns experimented with creative lesson plans and arts-integrated pedagogy in real classrooms.
- **At NMIMS**, 11 MBA interns designed and implemented skill-based programs, merging management theory with social innovation.
